

### **Completed ECE® Aid Evaluations**



Over 1,400 free evaluation reports have been completed since the launch of ECE® Aid in 2016.

# **Big Numbers**

We had a record year in 2024 with close to 500 evaluation reports completed through the ECE® Aid initiative.

One of the biggest contributors to this increase was our dedicated ECE® Board of Directors and brilliant finance team. It was their decision to shift away from fundraising and instead use a percentage of ECE® revenue to fund ECE® Aid fee waivers.

As revenue forecasting is a bit more predictable than fundraising efforts, we were able to distribute a much larger amount of coupons for fee waivers to ECE® Aid participating organizations and institutions in 2024.

In 2024 ECE® Aid recipients were educated in Ukraine, Afghanistan, Nigeria, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Ghana, Colombia, Russia, India, Haiti, Rwanda, Cuba, Pakistan, Egypt, Jordan, Ethiopia, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Iran, Guatemala, Dominican Republic, Sudan, Mexico, Venezuela, Kenya, Uganda, Brazil, Cameroon, Spain, Jamaica, Vietnam, Morocco, El Salvador, Nepal, Tunisia, Chad, Poland, Burundi, Belarus, Türkiye, South Korea, Switzerland, Marshall Islands, Malawi, Moldova, United Kingdom, Ecuador, and China.
