The seasoned researcher has a Ph.D. from the University of British Columbia, a master's from McGill and a Bachelor of Arts Honours from the University of Ottawa.



"I am driven by the power of international connectedness and understanding," said Yasmeen. "ECE's reach is unlimited; they are a critical resource for global students and professionals. It seems fitting to start the new year by empowering people to make the future they envision a reality."

Interim Co-Chair Kavita Pandit departed ECE in December. The team is grateful for the knowledge, inspiration and insight she brought to the organization.
